She grew up attending the First Congregational Church in Wallingford, Connecticut and was very active in youth activities. *(cont'd on back pg.)*



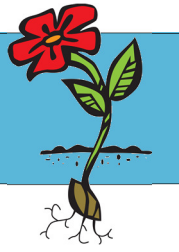

Young Adult Volunteers Commissioned at Worship Service

Each summer, we are blessed to meet several people who are beginning a year of service through the Presbyterian Church (USA) through a program called "Young Adult Volunteers (YAV)." The YAV program is an ecumenical, faith-based year of service for young people, ages 19-30, in 22 sites around the world and in the United States. All the volunteers participate in training at the Stony Point Center and then fan out to local congregations for their commissioning. Because our first cooking class was so well received, we have decided to offer more. Harry Lewis' original idea was to provide basic cooking lessons for our youth going off to college and we do have a plan to offer this type of class again during the Christmas break.

However, several of you have expressed interest in having more advanced classes. We are excited to offer classes, but we need to know what you're interested in making. Freedom for Shane Watson!

After 25 years of incarceration, Shane Watson appeared before the Parole Board in Otisville on June 26. In an extremely quick decision, the Parole Board granted Shane his freedom and set his release date for October 9, 2018, the earliest allowable release date under the terms of Shane's sentence.

Shane wrote that his meeting with the Parole Board felt like "a supernatural occurrence," unusual in many ways. He was able to speak to each one of the commissioners, which is rare, even maintaining his innocence. He said that decisions can take up to 14 days, but he got his in 48 hours. He is grateful for every prayer and for the many support letters written on his behalf.

For more than a dozen years, our congregation has been praying for Shane, corresponding with him, and helping to raise funds for his legal defense. Shane and his family are deeply grateful for all of the support they have received, not just from our church but from the wide network of folks who have joined this effort to bring about justice for Shane.

On July 10th, Shane was moved from Otisville Correctional Facility to Queensboro Correctional Facility, a minimum-security prison, where most inmates are sent just prior to their release.
